
Stay in touch! If you have an interesting topic you'd like to share or a question just get in touch and we'll publish or try to answer.

Digging season is getting underway and our scouts have already been out looking for new projects to add to our existing programme of digs. We're also pleased to open the 2023 season of monthly meetings. As usual these will be held on the 3rd Wednesday each month up to October, and the venue is the Village Centre, Great Eccleston. Our opening meeting on 15th February

saw a good turnout including several new members and there was lively discussion about the dig programme.

Dig News

The dig at **Brock** cottages will be continuing mainly on Thursdays but there will potentially be a few weekend digs at the site.



A return to the **Wardleys** site is also planned, probably around early to mid-April and Chris, the dig leader for that project, has identified several target areas for excavation.



Meanwhile, Andy has spotted some intriguing stonework on the possible line of a Roman road near **Caton, Lancaster**. An email has been sent to those on the Diggers' Register for a dig planned for **Sunday 5**th **March**.



New Member Jenny came to our rescue by offering a spot in a field in **Bilsborrow** to store our digging equipment. Coincidentally, it appears that the line of the Roman road that we *didn't* find at John Cross School may actually cross that very field and there are other intriguing features nearby that merit investigation. We're in the process of buying a shed for our kit and hopefully will also be able to have a dig there.

We learnt that the investigation into the **Roman** *vicus* at **Kirkham** may be proceeding this summer having received external funding, so we'll be hopeful of being involved once again. Details will follow when received.

Andy has also been busy investigating a potential site close to our Roman road dig at **Cabus**. There are indications of a building platform in a nearby field and whilst it's known a cottage once occupied the spot, it is on the line of our Roman road so who knows what else may be there?
